But now thus says the Lord, he who created you, O Jacob, he who formed you, O Israel: Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you.

Acts 2: 14a, 36-41

On the day of Pentecost, Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed the crowd, 'Let the entire house of Israel know with certainty that God has made him both Lord and Messiah, this Jesus whom you crucified.' Now when they heard this, they were cut to the heart and said to Peter and to the other apostles, 'Brothers, what should we do?' Peter said to them, 'Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ so that your sins may be forgiven; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is for you, for your children, and for all who are far away, everyone whom the Lord our God calls to him.' And he testified with many other arguments and exhorted them, saying, 'Save yourselves from this corrupt generation.' So those who welcomed his message were baptized, and that day about three thousand persons were added to their number.

Luke 24: 13-35

Now that same day two of them were going to a village called Emmaus, about seven miles from Jerusalem. They were talking with each other about everything that had happened. As they talked and discussed these things with each other, Jesus himself came up and walked along with them; but they were kept from recognizing him. He asked them, "What are you discussing together as you walk along?" They stood still, their faces downcast. One of them, named Cleopas, asked him, "Are you only a visitor to Jerusalem and do not know the things that have happened there in these days?"

"What things?" he asked. "About Jesus of Nazareth," they replied. "He was a prophet, powerful in word and deed before God and all the people. The chief priests and our rulers handed him over to be sentenced to death, and they crucified him; but we had hoped that he was the one who was going to redeem Israel. And what is more, it is the third day since all this took place. In addition, some of our women amazed us.

They went to the tomb early this morning but didn't find his body. They came and told us that they had seen a vision of angels, who said he was alive. Then some of our companions went to the tomb and found it just as the women had said, but him they did not see." He said to them, "How foolish you are, and how slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have spoken! Did not the Christ have to suffer these things and then enter his glory?" And beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, he explained to them what was said in all the scriptures concerning himself.

As they approached the village to which they were going, Jesus acted as if he were going farther. But they urged him strongly, "Stay with us, for it is nearly evening; the day is almost over." So he went in to stay with them. When he was at the table with them, he took bread, gave thanks, broke it and began to give it to them. Then their eyes were opened and they recognized him, and he disappeared from their sight. They asked each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he talked



with us on the road and opened the Scriptures to us?" They got up and returned at once to Jerusalem. There they found the Eleven and those with them, assembled together and saying, "It is true! The Lord has risen and has appeared to Simon." Then the two told what had happened on the way, and how Jesus was recognised by them when he broke the bread.

Dear Church Family

Well, how are you getting on in 'lockdown'? As I was reflecting on this word I thought how easy it would be to consider ourselves imprisoned in our homes as we do not have the freedom to go about as before. BUT how much better it is to think of our homes as places of sanctuary. After all the reason we are confined is for protection both of ourselves and others.

The term sanctuary means protection or a safe place and in the bible there are countless references. One of my favourites is in psalm 73:16,17

When I tried to understand all this, it troubled me deeply till I entered the sanctuary of God; then I understood their final destiny.

The psalmist was agonising over the actions of evil and arrogant people, but when he entered the sanctuary he was able to see things from God's perspective. I have found this helpful when struggling with issues that leave me perplexed and confused – that sense of entering the sanctuary of God's presence realigns my perspective. The global pandemic which is causing such death and destruction impacts all of us leaving us confused, anxious and fearful for ourselves, our families and indeed our world. In the midst of this God's sanctuary is open, we are free to go there and sit with him; to ask for courage, for faith to meet each new day. The psalm concludes with this affirmation:

Yet I am always with you; you hold me by my right hand. You guide me with your

counsel, and afterward you will take me into glory. Whom have I in heaven but you?

And earth has nothing I desire besides you. My flesh and my heart may fail,

but God is the strength of my heart and my portion forever.

I'm attaching a short form of evening prayer which I hope you might find helpful. I have also attached an order of service for Sunday and the readings each speak about the powerful effect of God's presence. The beautiful verses from Isaiah 43 assure us of the protection of God's presence in the face of trouble. The passage from Acts reminds us of the certainty of the resurrection, the need for repentance and the promise of forgiveness. Doctor Luke recounts the journey of the disciples unaware of their companion's identity until his presence was revealed as they shared a meal together. Even if we are not aware of it, God's presence is with us as he has promised. During this time while we are unable to meet together for worship, I pray that each of you would enter into the sanctuary of God's presence and there find peace and blessing, all that you need, in fact, to face each new day.
