COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS UPDATE – 18th OCTOBER 2021

We have now received a communication from the Bishop of Connor and I am quoting below the most relevant parts for our church worshippers.



"With the recent easing of Covid-19 restrictions in various sectors across the community, there are some new updates which affect our Church buildings, acts of worship and parish meetings. Despite some easing of the restrictions, we still have to mindful that the transmission rate is very high and therefore have to continue to do everything we can to keep everybody safe.

Face coverings: It remains a legal requirement that face coverings are worn when entering and leaving the church building and when moving around. It remains vitally important that face coverings are worn during congregational singing because Covid-19 is an airborne virus. It is recommended that face coverings are worn during the whole service, but they may be removed when people are seated and not singing but that is a matter of personal preference.

Entering and leaving the church building: The Chief Medical Officer and Chief Scientific Advisor remain concerned about potential spread of the virus when people chat informally outside the doors of the church before and after services. In those more relaxed settings people tend to let down guard and can easily forget the risks from close contact with those who are not of their household. It would be worth reminding people of this.
