The anticipation of Christmas with all the commercial pressure that comes with it, and all the expectations built around one twenty-four hour period in the whole year, makes it more and more difficult for us not to forget the important season upon which we enter today.

The season of Advent not only marks the beginning of the Church's liturgical year, but in it we are encouraged to prepare ourselves in heart and mind for a meaningful celebration of the Nativity of our Lord – his birth – which we celebrate on Christmas Day.

And yet that is not all!

The word "Advent" is derived from the Latin word *adventus*, meaning "coming," which is a translation of the Greek word *Parousia*, and during this season we are also encouraged to reflect on, and prepare ourselves for, the return of Christ at the 2nd coming.



So this season, like Lent, is marked by many as a time of spiritual reflection, penance and fasting (but don't try fasting for the WHOLE of Advent!), allowing us to focus on **'the real reason for the season'.**

So I hope there will be moments during Advent when YOU will be able to step back from the commercial hype and frenzied preparations and focus on Him who WAS and IS and IS to come – Jesus Christ our Lord!
