This time away has provided an opportunity to think about our finances. For example it has not been possible for most you to make your weekly freewill offering. I know that many of you will have been putting the envelopes away week by week and that is greatly appreciated. However you might now consider making your gift through a standing order. I'm enclosing the necessary form if you would like to do that.

As you know I was due to leave the parish at the beginning of May. I put this on hold not wishing to put the parish into a vacancy at such a difficult time. Now that we are in a position to return to church, I have informed the Bishop and the Vestry that I will put that delayed departure into effect on 27 September. This will give us five Sundays being back together and provide an opportunity to become accustomed to the differences in worshipping together. Bishop designate George, who will be consecrated on Sunday 6 September, will be with us for my final Sunday.



Here is the news we have all been waiting for! We return to 'in church' worship on Sunday 30 August – St Aidan's Day!

As you will be aware, the legislation due to Covid 19 means that things in church will be different from what we are used to. We will all have to comply with the Covid 19 policy which has been set down by the church authorities. The aim is to help everyone stay safe and to minimise the spread of the virus. I have set out the relevant points which will help prepare you as you return to a familiar and much loved setting with a very different way of being there.

I suppose the greatest challenge will be seeing each other after a long absence without the opportunity to interact with one another in the usual way. We will all have to get used to the impact of social distancing – you will be seated as you arrive, appropriately distanced from your neighbour. Please read through the instructions carefully and just be prepared to enjoy a different experience of gathering for worship. (continued on back page)

## RETURN TO CHURCH GUIDELINES

- You will be met by a steward as you enter the Church and asked to sanitize your hands. You will be given a service sheet which you should take home with you.
- Your FWO can be placed in the baskets at the door as you enter.
- You will be directed to a seat.
   This will most likely not be your usual seat, but the one allocated to allow for 2 metres social distance.
   Families and those who are in a 'bubble' will be able to sit together. If you have a cushion in church it can be collected from the back as you enter. You will then need to take it home and bring it each week.
- The church authorities have now recommended the wearing of face masks in church.
- During the service you are asked to remain in your seat. If anyone wishes to use the toilet, please use cleaning materials supplied before you leave.
- Until the advice changes, there will be no congregational singing so no choir for the time being.

- Holy Communion will be bread only distributed from the chancel steps. You will be directed to approach and return to maintain social distancing.
- A photograph of the congregation will be taken to comply with contact tracing.
- At the end of the service, leave as directed by the stewards.
- There will be no refreshments after the service.
   If the weather allows, do chat for a few moments outside the church grounds to catch up but keep socially distanced.
- If you are feeling unwell or have any Covid 19 symptoms you are asked to stay at home.

It is not necessary to deep clean the church provided there are 72 hours between services. Accordingly access to the church is limited to Wednesdays and Sundays.

These guidelines will be updated as necessary to comply with current legislation.
