Tuesday: Choose one item from the news headlines and bring that situation to God in prayer.

Wednesday: Pray for young people and leaders involved in Children's Church, Messy Church, Girls' Brigade and remember Alison Shaw, Family Worker Thursday: Pray for members of the Select Vestry, Church Wardens, and all who give their time to various church activities. Friday: Pray for brothers and sisters in Christ who are being persecuted because of their faith. Look at the Open Doors website for up to date information. Saturday: Pray for Sunday Services, for Revd Bobbie, John, Organists Daniel and Gerald and the Choir that our worship may glorify God and bind us together as members of God's family. Pray that St Aidan's will be a beacon of light in the community and a place of welcome and acceptance. Sunday: Pray together in God's house if possible.

Dear Church Family,

How good it is to come from the dark winter months and into the light and new life of spring time. This movement from darkness to life vividly illustrates the events of the death and resurrection of Jesus the darkness of the crucifixion on Good Friday giving way to the light and new life of the resurrection on Easter Sunday. And we make that journey through the six weeks of Lent - a season of re-turning to God for healing and reconciliation. A sombre time as we acknowledge that we are a sinful people in need of God's forgiveness and healing. People often give up chocolate or sweets or maybe watching a favourite TV



programme as part of their Lenten discipline - but perhaps a better response is to give up some time, time to reflect and pray. There will be an opportunity to do just that in church. During Lent there will be a mid-week service beginning on Ash Wednesday and then each Thursday evening at 7.30pm. We will take the story of Joseph as a theme - there is so much to learn from his experience of life!

The parish mission statement which we launched last October 'To enable people to find a living faith in a loving God by serving Christ in the Community' requires team work - already a strong feature in our church family. However we are aware that there remains much to be done as we reach out into the community and I am delighted that Canon Ken McReynolds has accepted our invitation to join the ministry team. In his role as assistant minister Canon Ken will be visiting in the parish and joining us for occasional Sunday services. We extend a warm welcome to Canon Ken and his wife Dorothy and look forward to all they will bring to St Aidan's Church Family.

In his letter to the church in Corinth, the Apostle Paul writes: 'you are the body of Christ, and each one of you is a part of it'. (1 Cor. 12:27). That strong thread of team work - whether it be in cleaning the church, counting the money, helping in the thrift shop or with the tea rota, arranging flowers, involvement in the various organisations or Sunday Services - everyone offering their own particular skill, is an excellent example of Paul's body image.

'Each person is given something to do that shows who God is: Everyone gets in on it, everyone benefits'. The way God designed our bodies is a model for understanding our lives together as a church: every part dependent on every other part, the parts we mention and the parts we don't, the parts we see and the parts we don't. If one part hurts, every other part is involved in the burt, and in the healing. If one part flourishes, every other part enters into the exuberance'. (1 Cor.12:11,25-26 TM)

Valentine's

The flowers, candy, red hearts and romance are out of sight for another year on the passing of St. Valentine's Day, that's what we have come to believe, that's what it's all about, right, well maybe not. The origin of this holiday for the expression of love isn't romantic at all - at least not in the traditional sense.

Valentine was a Roman Priest at a time when Emperor Claudius persecuted the Church. Claudius had an edict that prohibited the marriage of young people. This was based on the hypothesis that unmarried soldiers fought better than married soldiers because married soldiers might be afraid of what might happen to their wives or families if they should die. Bear in mind that it was a very permissive society in which Valentine lived. Polygamy would have been much more popular than just one woman and one man living together. Yet some of them were attracted to the Christian Faith.

Obviously the Church thought that marriage was very sacred between one man and one woman for life and that it was to be encouraged.

The idea of encouraging couples to marry within the Christian Church was what Valentine was about and he secretly married them because of the edict from Claudius.

Valentine was eventually caught, imprisoned and tortured for performing marriage ceremonies against the command of Emperor Claudius the second.

There are legends surrounding Valentine's actions while in prison. One of the men who was to judge him in line with Roman Law was a man called Asterius whose daughter was blind. Valentine supposedly prayed with and healed the young girl with such astonishing effect that Asterius himself became a Christian as a result.

Valentine was sent to a three part execution of a beating, stoning and finally a decapitation all because of his stand on Christian marriage. The story goes that the last words he wrote were in a note to the daughter of Asterius. He inspired todays romantic missives by signing it "from your Valentine."

There comes a time when you have to lay your life on the line for what you believe and with the power of the Holy Spirit we can do that - even to the point of death.

Valentines martyrdom has not gone un-noticed by the general public. In fact Whitefriars Street Church Dublin is one of three churches that claim to house the remains of Valentine.

Today many people make the pilgrimage to the church to honour the courage and memory of this Christian Saint. St. Valentine has become to be known as the patron Saint of Lovers.
