Dear Church Family,

As the darkness of winter gives way to Spring we welcome a season of new life, new beginnings. That is certainly the case for all of us in St Aidan's. We celebrate the one hundred and twenty fifth Anniversary of the Church later this month, moving **Forward in Faith** to a new season of ministry and mission. Plans are being developed for the reordering of the church to provide both a worship space and modern facilities in line with our mission statement: **"Enabling people to find a living faith in a Loving God, by serving Christ in the Community".**



Easter this year marks seven years of my ministry in St Aidan's.

When I came to the parish, it was with the firm conviction of God's timing and his calling. Now in response to his continuing call, the time has come to focus on a ministry which has also been part of my life for some time. As many of you know, I am the Mission Director of a small charity, Bird of Paradise Ministries in Rwanda, committed to providing a home for the elderly homeless there. I don't like the word retiring, but I am conscious of getting tired and I want to sharpen my focus at this stage of my life. In order to do this, I will be leaving the parish at the end of April. It will not be easy for me to leave, but I am certain that this is the right decision and am confident that God will lead the parish into the future he has planned.

Throughout my ministry, I have seen the care and support shown by parishioners both within the church family and to the wider community. I have appreciated the support and acceptance shown to me and continue to ask for your prayers as I follow God's call on my life.

In preparation for the new beginnings God is leading us into; we will be joining together in a study of chapters 2-4 of Ephesians under the heading 'Transformed Living'. For fifty days, during the season of Lent, right through to Easter we will explore together how to live in the light of what Christ has done for us and in us. In the words of the Apostle Paul:

I beg you to live and act in a way worthy of those who have been chosen for such wonderful blessings as these. Be humble and gentle. Be patient with each other, making allowance for each other's faults because of your love. Try always to be led along together by the Holy Spirit and so be at peace with one another.

We are all parts of one body, we have the same Spirit, and we have all been called to the same glorious future. For us there is only one Lord, one faith, one baptism, and we all have the same God and Father who is over us all and in us all, and living through every part of us. **Eph.4:1-6**

A Word From Canon Ken

Dear Friends

When Dorothy and I moved in to our retirement accommodation four years ago we had a large garden (disproportionate to the size of our bungalow!) and I was happy as I like pottering in the garden - and we have two dogs!

However our joy was short lived because we soon realised that the whole site was wet clay and our garden seemed the worst. So we spent a lot of money having it drained, etc., but the improvement was only marginal. Consequently over these few years there have been numerous bulbs that massively underperformed or didn't appear at all, shrubs that died, bushes that promised prolific foliage and blooms but didn't grow in clay! The place was a disaster.

However in that fateful first Spring there was one exception – a solitary daffodil (which I hadn't planted) suddenly appeared at the base of a fence – and actually bloomed. So in the middle of all this mess there was one bloom! I remember saying to Dorothy that perhaps it was a symbol of God's promise of better days and new growth.

In the years since then I have undertaken a few projects in different parts of the garden and have had measured success. However every Spring this one solitary daffodil has returned and bloomed despite the fact that this particular patch is a swamp, has been neglected, gets little or no sun, has had a pile of stones dumped on it – but guess what – it's there again this week! A symbol of hope, renewal, restoration, new life from deadness – a thing of beauty.



Obviously I don't know where YOU feel yourself to be in your life just now, but maybe some of you are running low in hope, depressed, lonely or fearful and finding it difficult to take your eyes of your gloomy circumstances, so I want to share my daffodil with you.

This photo is from our first year when it had to combat a snowstorm.

It's not the best daffodil you'll ever see but to me it represents a miracle – a new beginning!

So remember God's activity in our lives is not restricted to circumstances or surroundings. I pray there'll be many miracles in YOUR lives.
